COMMUNITY AND INTERGATION

Local Enhancement Programme 2026

Applications for LEP 2026 closed on the 27th February, with 137 successful applications received. Leitrim's allocation for 2026 is €119,043.40 for capital projects and purchases only. Drawdown process is underway. Groups are submitting a significant amount of change requests which are processed with the Dept. This is due to a 41% increase in the number of groups participating in 2026 resulting in diluted grant payments to groups.

Age Friendly Programme

Age Friendly Ireland have nearly completed the nursing home project in Leitrim and Roscommon. Evaluation meeting to provide feedback to AFI scheduled for August. Work continues with internal and external stakeholders to progress a Climate Action Course for over 55's in Leitrim. Promotional materials finalised and are circulated. Recruitment of community champions to support uptake continues.

Healthy Ireland

- A change request is currently being prepared for submission to Pobal due in September. The proposed amendment will refocus the breastfeeding initiative towards Positive Mental Health, with project partners, target groups and outputs currently being identified. Approval from the LCDC is required prior to submission.
- Collaborating with PEACE to coordinate events and volunteer engagement as part of the Caring for Carers Programme, with young carers being a potential target group.
- The Fit Farmers App Launch event is scheduled for 27th of August in Mohill Library. An event plan is in place and promotion is underway.

Period Poverty Initiative

- Discussions are underway with Leitrim LGFA regarding the rollout of period product packs for club players and a period health awareness talk. A meeting with LGFA representatives is being planned to secure agreement and progress implementation.

Comhairle na nÓg

- A Foróige Coordinator has been appointed to re-establish Comhairle na nÓg. A steering committee is being established, with the first meeting scheduled for September.

- The coordinator will be engaging with schools and local youth groups/GAA clubs in September to recruit and onboard new Comhairle members, with a focus on increasing participation and awareness of Comhairle na nÓg. Membership currently stands at approximately 10 young people.

Love Where You Live

Judging is now complete for the Love Where You Live Competition. Winners will be announced at the Love Where You Live Awards event on 1ST October.

Local Environmental Action Fund - LEAF

The Local Environmental Action Fund (LEAF) is a new funding stream aimed at Tidy Towns groups and other voluntary groups who carry out environmental work in their area. This fund is jointly funded by IPB insurance and Leitrim County Council and will see €100k invested in community led environmental projects throughout the county. Assessment of the applications is completed with successful projects to be announced in August 2026.

Local Community Regeneration & Transformation

- Play & Art Therapy Centre, Drumkeeran - Works continuing onsite – building is plastered internally and footpaths & groundworks completed outside. On schedule for completion by Qtr3.
- Carrick-on-Shannon Youth Arts & Community - internal furnishings being finalised.
- One Tender received for MUGA in Ballinamore.

Thriving & Peaceful Communities

- QQI Level 7 – All students met for their course overview online on the 15th July and submitted the final task assignments.
- Volunteer Support Programme – PP team met to discuss capacity building opportunities for volunteers.
- Virtual Reality Program –Orla Casey Creative has begun programme delivery.
- Biodiversity Programme – Philip Farrelly & Co. meetings took place with farmers to discuss the development of plans. Habitat for Knowledge was appointed to support community groups participating in the cross-community biodiversity project.
- Support for Most Isolated – meeting took place to discuss programme development with the newly appointed Healthy County Co-Ordinator.
- Wellness & Nutrition – dates and locations for course has been set for September. Courses taking place in Cashel on the 8th, 15th & 22nd Oct and Garrison on the 17th, 25th September & 1st Oct

Celebrating Cultural Diversity

- Digital Camps for Young People – Harp Media delivered a 5-day camp in The Glens Centre, Manorhamilton. There are 2 more camps planned for August.
- Practical Skills training courses – SAFEPASS & LANTRA First Aid Course commenced in July in Carrick on Shannon and Drumshanbo. Delivered by the Ballinamore Area Community Council.
- Traveller Programme – Short Story Film Project - Filming completed awaiting edits.

PEACEPLUS Shannonside Peace Arena (1.4)

- The SRC construction tender remains active within the tender response period. Upwards of 90 clarification requests have been submitted and responded to by month ending July.
- The final queries for the CSSF funding stream have been responded to with formal approval ongoing.
- Engagement with the SRC Communications Team continues, with the 2nd draft of the next issue of the newsletter currently underway.
- The LSSIF business case is in its final stages with submission expected by end of August.

- Six claims for the period November 2024 to April 2026 have been uploaded to the SEUPB expenditure portal and subsequently certified as outlined below. Claim 7 is now being drafted.

Local Community Safety Partnership

A public consultation has now been completed and consultation findings are being analysed to inform the development of the Local Community Safety Plan. The Community Safety Plan Subcommittee has been established and will support the identification of priorities and development of actions for inclusion in the Plan. Two applications were submitted under the Community Safety Fund by Leitrim LCSP.

Leitrim Local Community Development Committee

At its meeting on 15th July 2026, the Leitrim Local Community Development Committee (LCDC) approved one LEADER project with a total funding value of €23,774.46.

Local Authority Integration Team (LAIT)

The Integration Team delivered a total of thirteen clinics supporting individuals and families to access appropriate services.

- Five clinics were held for Beneficiaries of Temporary Protection (BOTP).
- Eleven clinics were delivered across IPAS Centres.

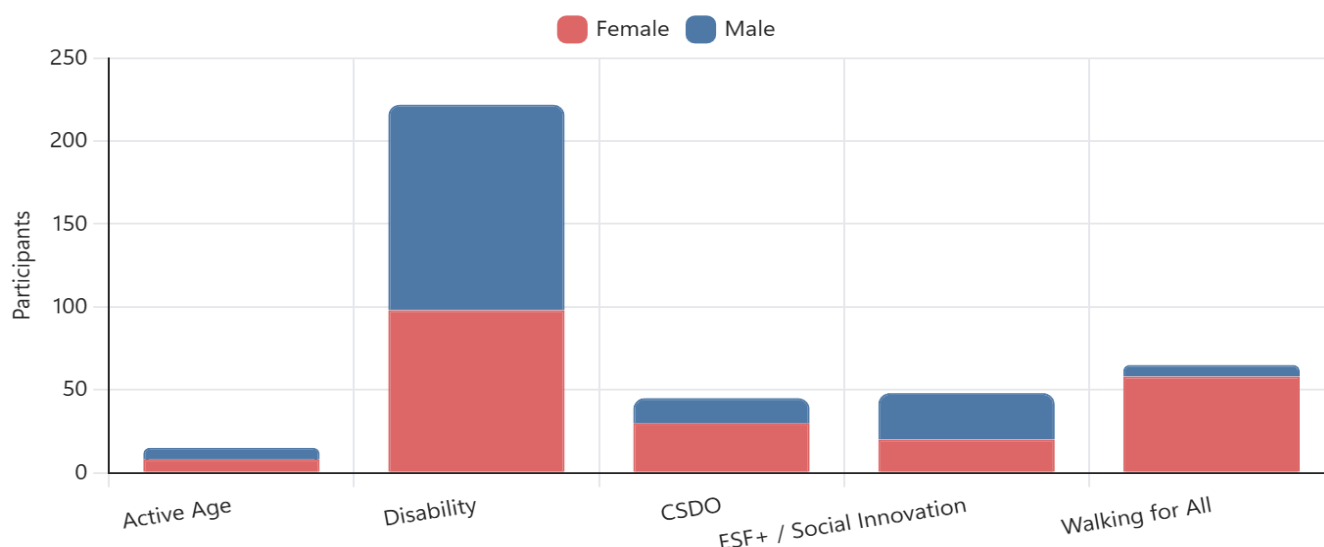
The Wellbeing Advantage Workshop Series, delivered in partnership with Healthy Ireland, continued throughout was completed in the first week of July. This 12-week programme promoted health and wellbeing through a range of activities, including walking and running groups, wellbeing information sessions, and individual health assessments.

LAIT worked in collaboration with Foróige to deliver a summer camp programme for young people aged 10 to 18 years residing in Carraig Accommodation Centre. During July, 19 young people enjoyed two organised day trips, while variety social activities were also facilitated within the centre.

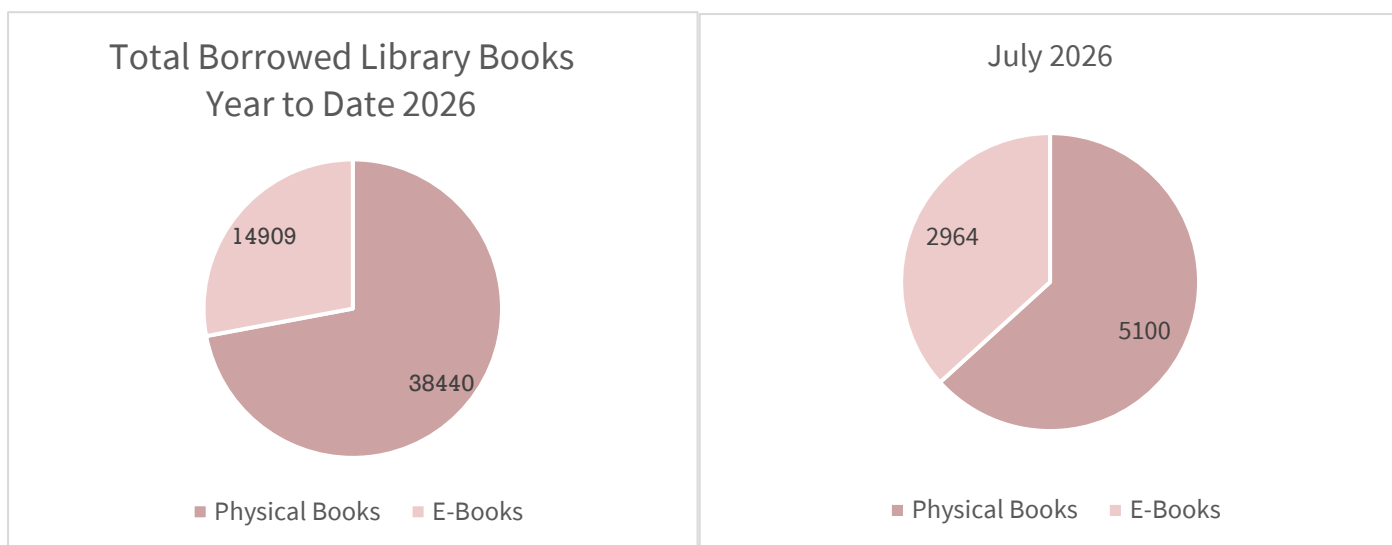

LIBRARY SERVICES



At the end of July 900 children have signed up for the Summer Stars Programme. All libraries had a programme of events and activities to include story time, arts and crafts, painting workshops and scavenger hunts with games night in Carrigallen taking place every Thursday during the summer proving very popular. Many of the libraries also welcomed visits from local summer camps and provided storytime sessions in local childcare facilities. Drumshanbo Library hosted a number of other well attended events and also acted as a venue for many of the Joe Mooney Summer School Workshops.

Meanwhile, the bi-monthly Dementia Inclusive Social Club continued to take place in Mohill and Carrick Library, providing a welcoming and supportive space for people living with dementia, their families, friends, and carers to meet, socialise, and enjoy shared activities.

Our Local Studies Librarian was busy meeting with local heritage and historical groups within the county to strengthen partnerships, promote the Local Studies service, and explore opportunities to support the preservation and sharing of local history and heritage.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

STEM Passport for Inclusion- Maynooth University & ATU

Schools continue their assignments with ATU. Date of November 2nd confirmed for Graduation of Leitrim Students.

Carrick on Shannon Business Campus (Enterprise Hub)

Meetings with BABLE GmbH and the working group continued in relation to the priming phase of the proposed Enterprise Hub at the Carrick-on-Shannon Business Campus.

Leitrim's Diaspora Strategy 2026-2030

Planning continued for the official launch event at Margaret's Cottage, Carrigallen on 5th August 2026.

Leitrim Economic Forum

Work continues on the Development of the Economic and Skills strategy for Leitrim and on the planning of the Leitrim Ambassadors Summit, two initiatives of the Forum. The summit is scheduled for September 2026.

Shaping Leitrim- A Place led Economic and Skills Strategy for Leitrim 2026-2035.

A draft document is currently under review. One -to -one meetings have taken place with action owners to progress sign off on action plan. It is expected that the Economic and Skills Strategy will be published in September.

Global Business Network

The next meeting of the group is scheduled for 30th September 2026.

"Most Definitely Leitrim" Remote Working/Croí Cónaithe Social Media Campaign

The campaign's success continued throughout July and is being received positively. It is set to run for another few weeks. Responses to the remote working survey have been encouraging to date.

DRCDG Funded Schemes

The Outdoor Recreation Investment Scheme (ORIS) webinar was hosted on 2nd July 2026. Fourteen projects were submitted to the Department by the Clár deadline of 3rd July. Two projects were submitted under the RRDF call to Department for 28th July. The ORIS scheme closed for Expressions of Interest on 30th July.

TOURISM

Marketing Campaign

The Daycation campaign continued with a regional radio partnership on iRadio, designed to boost the short break market. The campaign highlighted a diverse range of attractions across County Leitrim and inspired listeners to plan their own getaway, supported by a strong call to action directing audiences to the Enjoy Leitrim website.

Social media activity continued throughout the period, promoting festivals and events, highlighting relevant stories, and showcasing local attractions, outdoor activities, slow tourism experiences, and food and drink offerings. We also hosted our photography competition, which generated strong engagement across platforms. In addition, the Tourism App continues to be promoted through digital and social media channels, supported by branded merchandise distributed throughout the county to increase visibility and uptake.

Social Media

We were delighted to welcome Fleetwood Jack (Jack Ring) to Leitrim recently, where he shared the highlights of his trip with his 753,000 Instagram followers. Throughout his stay, Jack captured the essence of County Leitrim, from its breathtaking landscapes and outdoor adventures to its vibrant local attractions and unique charm. His videos received an outstanding response online, offering a excellent showcase of everything Leitrim has to offer and a spotlight on the county as a must visit destination.

Publicity

In July, we featured Margaret's story, which went on to receive national, regional, and international publicity. Coverage was particularly strong in the United States, where IrishCentral.com published a warm and engaging piece on Margaret of New Orleans, helping to bring her legacy to a wider global audience and significantly boosting awareness of the project.

Acres Lake

The new Acres Lake Facility in Drumshanbo has officially opened, bringing a high-quality lakeside amenity to the local community and visitors. The modern facility features hot showers, toilets, changing rooms, free lockers, outdoor showers, and a dedicated board wash-down area, making it an excellent resource for swimmers, paddlers, and all lake users.

Open daily from 7:00 am to 9:00 pm, the space is designed to support both recreational use and tourism, enhancing the overall experience at Acres Lake. A targeted social media campaign supported the launch, generating strong engagement and awareness across the region. An official opening event is planned for September, which will further highlight the facility's importance and celebrate this addition to Drumshanbo outdoor infrastructure.

LOCAL ENTERPRISE OFFICE (LEO)

Training, Mentoring & Export

A number of people received training in July as we ran a series of courses such as Meta Ads Masterclass: Facebook and Instagram Advertising that Works, Start Your Own Business Weekend Course, How to Develop a Winning Business Plan and Using Artificial Intelligence in Your Business training session. Demand for one-to-one mentoring continues to remain high. Assistance is also available on Export related issues and can be booked online free of charge to discuss any issues facing businesses or identifying and managing opportunities available for exporting.

All In a Day's Work Programmes & Associated Financial Supports

The "All In a Day's Work" campaign continues to be rolled out on the areas of Lean, Green and Digital supports. There is significant growth in demand for all three supports, in particular the Energy Efficiency Grant (EEG) and Grow Digital (GD) Voucher. The EEG, with up to 75% of eligible costs up to a maximum grant of €10,000 can be supported following the completion of a Green for Business, Green Start or a SEAI Energy Audit. The GD voucher is a grant covering 50% of eligible costs (minimum grant of €500 up to a

maximum grant of €5,000) limited to new software subscriptions for a period of 12 and training and configuration of the software.

Atlantic Economic Corridor Update:

Interreg Europe Digital Rural: Leitrim continues its partnership under Interreg Europe. The Digital Rural Project empowers rural communities through smart technologies and collaborative policymaking to foster sustainable regional development.

PEACE Plus – DS3 Project

Workshops and clinics with the Mobile Fab Lab are ongoing under the DS3 Project under PEACE Plus (Smart Towns & Villages). The project will run until July 2028 and offers free digital mentoring, skills development and community-focused digital inclusion activities. This programme is offered to SMEs, micro businesses, community/voluntary groups and individuals located in rural towns and villages. Schools can also avail of workshops with the mobile labs.

Creative Heartlands

The programme 'Creative Heartlands on Screen' continues with training and mentoring for the screen sector in Leitrim, Sligo and Roscommon with funding from Screen Ireland. A comprehensive mentorship programme has been established. Partnership with Creative Skillsnet continues and is entering its third year.

Northwest Regional Enterprise Plan Implementation

Northwest Vision Development

The 3 Chief Executives from Leitrim/Sligo/Donegal are collaborating to develop a Northwest Region Vision which will feed into the REP development in 2026. Leitrim CoCo is represented on the project by Director of Economic Development and the NW REP Programme Manager.

10xNW 2026

The Northwest Region came together to host the 10xNW entrepreneurship exchange in February 2026 in Leitrim. After a very successful event the 11 entrepreneurs and mentors continue to engage with each other throughout March as part of the commitment under the programme.

Next REP development

The Final report of the Northwest Regional Enterprise Plan 2022-2025 is currently in draft form and was submitted to DETE in mid-January. Once approved by DETE will be published on DETE website. Currently DETE are undergoing a review of the REPs with the intention of taking recommendations from the review towards the next REP development which is due to kick off Q2 2026.

ROADS

Annual Area Programme 2026

The Annual Area Programme of Works for 2026 is well underway.

N4 Carrick-on-Shannon Bypass & Traffic Management Project

The N4 Carrick-on-Shannon Bypass & Traffic Management Project is progressing as follows:

- Phase 3 – Design and Environmental Evaluation is ongoing.

- The Phase 3 Environmental Impact Assessment Report (EIAR) is currently being updated based on comments from TII & Legal review
- Ground investigation fieldwork has been completed on-site in the Material Deposition/Reuse Area located east of the River Shannon.
- The River Shannon Bridge is under final design with input from specialist bridge architects
- The Preliminary Business Case and associated Cost Benefit Analysis is currently under final update
- The Draft CPO/PRO deposit maps and schedule have been prepared and are under review
- All phase 3 surveys such as Ground Investigation, Topographical, archaeological, ecological etc. are now complete on site

National Road Pavement Overlay Schemes

- **N16 Pavement Overlay Scheme (POS) - Manorhamilton to Cornacloy Phase 1** – This POS Scheme was completed in 2023, and final Retention has now been paid to the Contractor. A small section of the pavement scheme in Manorhamilton was excluded and is to be completed under the Manorhamilton Safe Routes to School Programme - these works are scheduled for completion in Qtr. 3 of 2026.
- **N16 Pavement Overlay Scheme (POS) - Manorhamilton to Cornacloy Phase 2** – This POS commenced in November 2024 and works are now substantially completed. Final Retention has been paid to the contractor. Final payment to the Consultant is outstanding before final close out of the scheme with TII.
- **N4 Pavement Overlay Scheme – Carrick on Shannon** – Design and tender documents complete for Phase 1 of the N4 Carrick Pavement Overlay Scheme (POS), tenders for the construction stage have been received and are under review, it is anticipated to go to construction with Phase 1 of the POS in Qtr. 3 of 2026. Phase 2 of the N4 Carrick POS will be developed separately and in conjunction with the N4 Carrick Road Safety Improvement Scheme (RSIS), Tenders are due back for the procurement of consultants for Phase 2 of the N4 Carrick POS and the N4 Carrick RSIS 07/07/2026
- **N16 Pavement Overlay Scheme - Stradrine to Esky Bridge** – Consultants RoadPlan have completed development of the pavement strengthening and reinstatement proposals for submission to TII, topographical surveying has been completed. It is anticipated that the scheme will be completed in two phases, one of which will overlap with the N16 Glenfarne VRU improvements.

Bridge Rehabilitation Programme

- **Shesknan Bridge Emergency Works** – Bridge Failure at Shesknan in North Leitrim with Local Road L-6100-0 closed to through traffic. Consultancy contract extended to progress engineering services for emergency works. Emergency inspection complete with recommendation to replace existing bridge endorsed by Leitrim County Council. Topographical surveying complete, ecological screening complete (the proposed bridge replacement works will not require an Appropriate Assessment or Environmental Impact Assessment Report), ground investigation works complete, detailed bridge design and compilation of tender documents ongoing.
- **Ecological Surveys** – Successful Ecologist appointed, site surveys are complete with reports in progress.

- **Rehabilitation Contracts** – Construction stage tendering ongoing for the bridge rehabilitation works, currently invitations to tender have been sent to 7 contractors for all 12 bridges (DOT allocations received for 12 Bridges, LCC applied for 18 bridges). Tender returns have been received for 9 contracts to date with 1 contract started (for 2 bridges in the Ballinamore MD).
- **Bridge Inventory and Maintenance Inspections** – Bridge surveys, inspections and inventory updates are ongoing, currently 96 bridges have been surveyed for 2026.

Specific Improvement Grants – Works include:

- **R289 Kilcoon** – Design Consultant appointed. Report on Options approved by Department. Ground Investigations and Topographical survey complete. Detailed design and tender documents complete. Landowner negotiations ongoing and at an advanced stage. It is hoped that construction stage tendering will commence in July 2026 subject to completion of the land acquisition agreements.
- **R280 Killarga** – Design Consultant appointed. Topographical surveying and Ground Investigations complete. Options Report complete and approved by the Department. Draft Part 8 documents complete. Detailed design process almost complete. Land acquisition negotiations with landowner ongoing.
- **R280 Loughmurran Realignment** – A new consultant engineer has been appointed for the scheme and is developing initial stages. Tenders for topographical surveying received and assessed, insurances outstanding before appointment of successful candidate. Concept designs developed by consultant engineer. Landownership identified with agreement reached on access for surveying. Procurement of surveys for invasive species and archaeology ongoing.
- **R278 Junctions** – Proposed Land take drawings issued to Area office for agreement with landowners.
- **R280 Erriff Retaining wall Rehabilitation** – Design Consultant appointed, Topographical survey complete, De-vegetation of Retaining Wall complete, Bat survey completed. Tenders for ground investigation works received, insurances outstanding before appointment of the successful candidate. Landowner negotiations ongoing

Community Involvement Schemes (CIS)

The CIS allocation for 2026 is €407,075. 4 schemes will be completed in Carrick MD, 3 in Ballinamore and 2 in Manorhamilton MD.

Local Improvement Schemes (LIS)

The 2026 LIS allocation of €434,040 has been received. The LIS list has been updated, currently there are 121 people on this list. It is hoped to complete 7 to 8 LIS's in 2026 with this LIS Allocation.

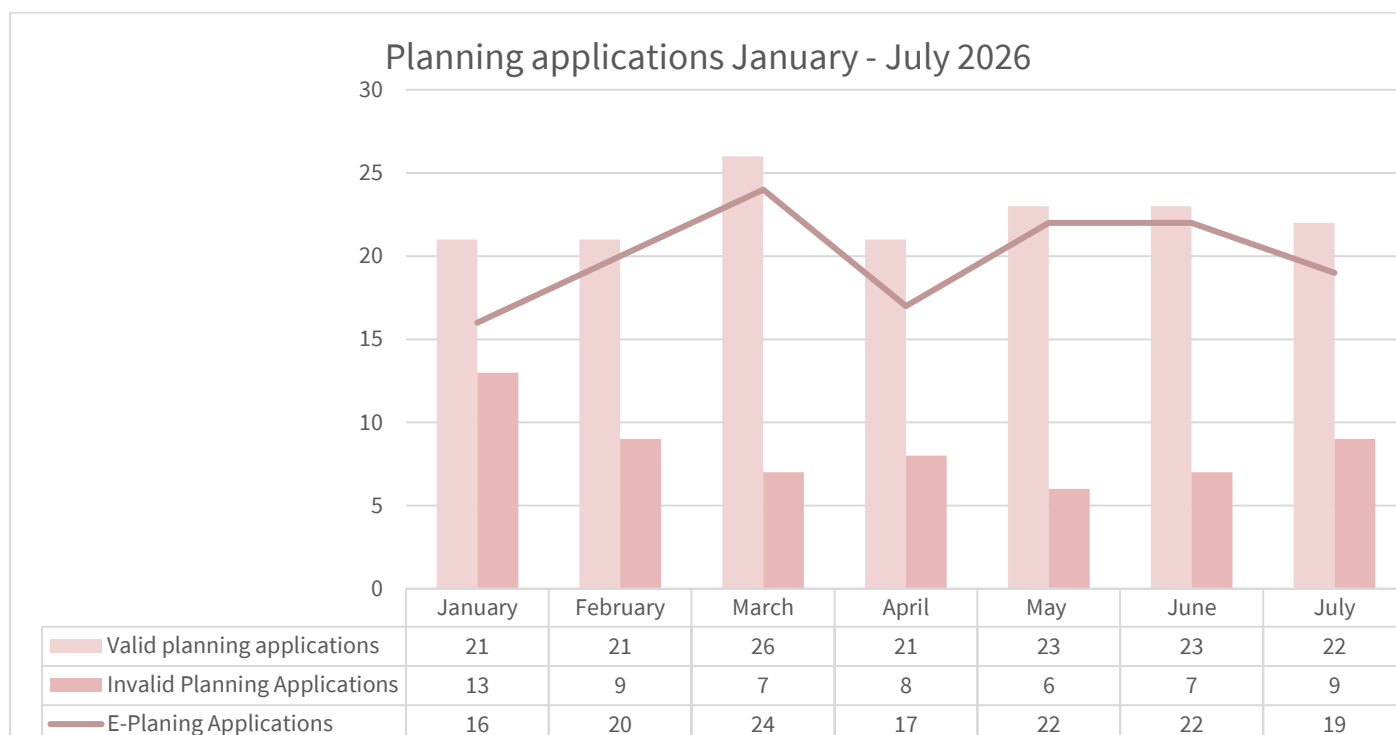

DEVELOPMENT MANAGEMENT



The Part 8 Public Consultation processes for 4 no. projects were completed / underway in July. Part 8 proposals for the refurbishment and change of use of the former courthouses in both Manorhamilton and Ballinamore and a proposed parks project for 4 areas in Carrick-on-Shannon were all approved at their respective Municipal District meetings. A proposed electric vehicle charging infrastructure project in Ballinamore was placed on public display on 24th July with submissions no later than 10th September.

Forward Planning

Variation to County Development Plan 2023-2029

The Chief Executive's report in relation to the submissions received was published in early June and submitted to the Elected Members for their consideration. The matter was considered further at the July Council meeting. A series of modifications to the proposed Variation were approved by the members to be placed on public display and subject to screening for SEA and AA under their respective EU Directives. The modifications were placed on public display on Wednesday 5th August, and will be on public display until the 2nd of September.

Residential Zoned Land Tax (RZLT)

Draft RZLT maps were published on Friday 30th January and public consultation ran until April 1st. 2 no. submissions were received requesting lands to be dezoned or rezoned. One of which relates to a site zoned residential use in Kinlough and the other of which is zoned residential in Drumshanbo. It is proposed to amend the zoning of both sites in the proposed Variation to the County Development Plan and the decision on each submission reflects same.

Heritage

- Leitrim County Council has received Shared Island grant funding as lead partner to carry out a joint cross border community project with Armagh City, Banbridge Craigavon Borough Council, which will celebrate the shared cultural heritage tradition of Mumming. Contractors have been appointed and project events scheduled.
- The *Leitrim Community Holy Wells* project is progressing. The archaeological field survey is complete. Volunteer training in archival research, online research and oral history recording has taken place and volunteers are being supervised with their research.
- The *Leitrim Community Fieldnames* project is progressing. In person and online workshops have taken place and volunteers are being coordinated.
- Two episodes of the *Connecting Through Heritage* podcast have been recorded which focus on the Leitrim Basket Project and the Leitrim Sweathouse Project. A further two episodes have been scheduled of August which will focus on Holy Wells in Leitrim and the Leitrim Fieldnames Project.
- Heritage Week has been promoted and events have been organised. These include a Leitrim Fieldnames Project Workshop; an open day and basket weaving demonstration at Glenview Folk Museum; a talk at St Hughes Well Ballinagleragh on Folk Medicine and Modernity; a talk on Holy Wells in Leitrim followed by a guided walk; an exhibition showcasing participants work from the Stories in Stitches project; and a walk through Dromod with Fionnuala Maxwell which will showcase traditional songs linked to the area.
- The *Community Monument Fund 2026* projects continue to be managed for both the Old Church of Ireland, Manorhamilton conservation works and the Manorhamilton Castle Conservation Management Plan.
