

### **CLIMATE ACTION**

- 1. Lunch & Learn series continued with speaker No. 4 Professor Neil Hewitt from University Ulster on Barriers and Pathways in developing a Decarbonising Zone (7 May 2025)
- 2. Climate Action participated in the EirGrid Roadshow (Landmark Hotel, 7 May 2025) stand (with LEO & TR) and speaker slot (with TR). Other speakers EirGrid, ESB Networks & SEAI. EirGrid & ESBN committed to decarbonise the electricity grid alongside twin track approach to facilitate improvement in energy efficiency of the end user.
- 3. SEAI Critical Success Scorecard annual review (13 May 2025). Energy performance has improved 10.2% against 2030 target (a 39.8% shortfall). Fossil fuel emissions have increased 2.8% over baseline. Leitrim CC making progress but not at the pace required and is one of the worst performers in comparison with other Local Authorities.

### **Town Regeneration**

### Croí Conaithe - Vacant Property Refurbishment Grant

Between April and May 2025, 17 new applications were received, bringing the total number of applications from January to May 2025 to 37. During this reporting period, 26 grant payments were processed, relating to applications submitted in 2023 and 2024.

### **Town Teams**

The Town Regeneration Officer and the Vacant Homes Officer continue to engage with town teams on general issues, town team governance and structure issues.

### **Manorhamilton Town Centre First Plan**

A contract has been entered into with Studio Myco for the preparation of a Town Centre First Plan for Manorhamilton. Studio Myco conducted a workshop with the transition year students of St. Clare's Comprehensive in Manorhamilton on Thursday, 01<sup>st</sup> May 2025. The first public consultation for the Plan took place at the Farmer's Market, Manorhamilton on Friday, 02<sup>nd</sup> May 2025 along with launching online survey forms for the public, businesses and artists to complete. Studio Myco are currently in the process of analysing and collating responses received.

### Kinlough, Dromahair & Ballinamore Town & Village Suite of Supports Funding

Minister Humphreys announced that Ballinamore, Dromahair and Kinlough were awarded €10,000 per town, under the Town Centre First, Town Team Support Fund. The funding may be used to support the establishment and/or development of town teams where they are not already well established, and to better understand the unique features of towns. Kinlough & Ballinamore have established Town Teams and adopted Constitutions. Work continued by the Dromahair Constitution Working Group on the draft constitution. The next meeting of Dromahair Town Team is scheduled for Tuesday, 17<sup>th</sup> June 2025 at 6.30pm in Dromahair Library.

Claims for funding were submitted in April 2025 and this has now been recouped from the DRCD.

### THRIVE - Town Centre First Heritage Revival Scheme - Application Strand 1 & 2

Leitrim County Council successfully secured funding under Strand 1 to carry out a feasibility study on the Town Hall Building in Carrick on Shannon to establish an end use for the building following widespread consultation process. The purpose of the funding stream is to reduce vacancy and dereliction by creating a sustainable and viable reuse of Heritage buildings, in line with Town Centre First Approach. Following a widespread consultation process, a Part 8 application was approved by the Elected Members on 12<sup>th</sup> May 2025 for "change of use of Town Hall from current office use to proposed multi-use community space / tourism use".

A further funding application has now been submitted under THRIVE Strand 2 in advance of the closing date of 30<sup>th</sup> May 2025 seeking funding for the capital element of the project to turn the Town Hall building into a River Shannon Interpretative Centre, community space and community garden. This is a competitive process, and successful applicants will be notified in due course.

The next meeting of the Local Development SPC is scheduled for 09th June 2025.

### **COMMUNITY AND INTEGRATION**

### **Age Friendly Programme**

Nursing Home Community Linkage Project Roscommon & Leitrim – Pilot programme

- Minister O'Donnell launched the project on the 28th May, visiting two nursing homes in Mohill.
- Community briefing sessions took place on 20<sup>th</sup> May, morning and afternoon sessions attended by circa 25 service providers and community groups.
- Briefing session for nursing home champions took place on the 29<sup>th</sup> May. This was an opportunity to train nursing home staff who will act as the point of contact for the coordinator and promote the project in their workplace.

### **Healthy Ireland**

Healthy Ireland continues to work with Sharon Richardson to roll out the Understand Together Campaign to make Leitrim Dementia Friendly. Over the Summer businesses and organisations will be invited to be audited to become Dementia Friendly, and Age Friendly. There will then be an event to celebrate progress for people with

dementia, their carers, friends and owners of Dementia Friendly businesses and organisations. The event will be in The Rainbow Ballroom of Romance and will feature Mike Hanrahan of Stocktons Wing and Sandy Kelly.

Two community events ran on May 15<sup>th</sup> as part of Mental Health Irelands Nationwide 'Hello! How are You?' awareness day. The events ran in The Bee Park and Breffni FRC. These Tea and Treats music circles were facilitated in Breffni FRC by Kristina Kenny and in Bee Park by Hugh Feely, with the public encouraged to bring their own instruments or come to listen and chat.

On May 23<sup>rd</sup> Mike Hanrahan from Stocktons Wing performed to a full house in The Mayflower Drumshanbo for our 'Mayflower Memories' Age Friendly Ireland event. The event targeted people living with dementia, their carers, family and friends. Philip Darcy showcased his Showband Memorabilia Exhibition there in the evening, that contains over 1500 pieces of memorabilia.

Funding has now been received from Pobal for Healthy Ireland Salary and Programme costs and 90% grants for 2025 are being distributed.

### **Love Where You Live**

All entries into The Love Where You Live Schools Competition were visited by Leitrim County Councill staff and independent judge, Oisin McGann, Author and illustrator. The theme was climate action. A winner and runner from each MD was chosen and they were presented with a cash prize of €500 and €250.

The Deadline for the 2025 Love Where You Live competition for community and voluntary groups was 26<sup>th</sup> May. This is a joint initiative of Leitrim Public Participation Network and Leitrim County Council. 65 entries were received across the 5 categories:

Green Community, Green Estate, Age Friendly Community, Social Inclusion and Community Achievement. Judging of entries will take place in late June with all entries being visited by Leitrim County Council Staff Members and Independent judges. The Love Where You Live Awards night will take place on 2<sup>nd</sup> October.

### **Capital Projects**

Recruitment for a technical resource to manage the delivery of the capital projects is complete with appointment of the successful candidate pending.

### Recruitment

Two Development Officer positions have been filled and a Project Officer for the SRC Project has also been appointed. The new staff are due to take up their positions in early June.

The position of a Monitoring Officer for the Council Action Plan has been re-advertised.

### PEACEPLUS Shannon side Peace Arena (1.4)

McAdam Design have been formally appointed for the design services for the Shannon side Recreational Campus. An initial online meeting has taken place with the Design Team and an onsite visit will be arranged for later this month.

### Local Authority Integration Team (LAIT)

The Integration Team conducted eight clinics. Three clinics focused on Beneficiaries of Temporary Protection; four clinics were onsite in Dromahair IPAS and 1 in Carraig Accommodation IPAS centre. All clinics were identifying needs of the residences/families.

3 Offer A Home activations took place in May accommodating 9 people which are Beneficiaries of Temporary Protection.

The Integration Team lead out the planning of Africia which was held on May 25<sup>th</sup> from 11am – 4pm at the Junction in Ballinamore. The Integration Team worked in collaboration with Leitrim Development Company, Leitrim Volunteer Centre, Leitrim Intercultural Community Group, Foróige and Ballinamore Towns Team. There were between 150—170 individuals/families in attendance on the day.



### LIBRARY SERVICES



There were 177 new library memberships recorded for May. There were almost 8,500 visits to libraries across the county with 7,757 active library members for May.

During the month all libraries were busy with the usual events such as reading and writing groups, knitting and craft sessions, language and games sessions as well as the following:

- Early learning Centres and primary school class visits continued in all branch libraries
- Adult creative writing sessions continued in Kiltyclogher and Carrigallen Library
- Adult Guidance Information Day took place in Manorhamilton library

The launch of a newly formed craft group called 'Craft Circle' took place in Dromahair Library on 27th May

My Little Library Book Bag 2025 was launched in May with a national press release on Friday 9<sup>th</sup> May. As part of the initiative, a 'My Little Library Book Bag' is available free for every child starting school in 2025 to help them to prepare for this big step.

The Leitrim Gathering event hosted by the Local Studies Librarian was well attended on Saturday 24<sup>th</sup>. The talk 'where trains once ran' by Padraig Griffin drew a crowd of 36 people. The 'Leitrim Gaelic Games: Reflections and Memories' Exhibition was displayed in Ballinamore Library on Friday 23<sup>rd</sup> and Saturday 24<sup>th</sup>.

There were 59 submissions for the Young Historian Awards 2025 from 3 secondary schools. The Local Studies Librarian attended the awards ceremonies in Ballinamore Community School (22 students), Carrigallen Vocational School (32 students) and Lough Allen College (5 Students). The overall YHA was awarded to Rose Gannon from Ballinamore Community School for her project about Crummy Townland, in Kiltubrid Parish.

# ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT, REGENERATION, SUSTAINABLE TRANSPORT & EMERGENCY SERVICES

### **ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT**

### **Broadband/STEM Initiatives**

Two national schools are taking part in the National Microsoft Dream Space showcase in early June, visits to the schools to support the groups taking part were scheduled in May. Ongoing updating of the connected community's website in May. National Schools were notified of the VEx Robotics Programme for Sept with a number expressing an interest.

### **Digital Strategy**

Work has now commenced on the consultation for the new strategy with a few public consultation sessions in May 2025. Meetings with staff from various depts within the Local Authority also took place to get their input on the new strategy. The consultation survey has been widely distributed both inside and outside the organisation.

### **County Promotion**

Progress has been made with the Irish Embassy in London along with representatives from a few neighbouring local authorities with a view to confirming an inter County promotion event for November 27<sup>th</sup> 2025. Planning meetings are also taking place with the LEO team around the Smart Towns and Village Conference for October 2025.

Meetings with members of the Carrick Campus advisory group have taken place with a view to hosting an event in September 2025 at Carrick Business Campus.

### **Leitrim Diaspora**

A key initiative in the Leitrim Diaspora Strategy, "The Leitrim Gathering" took place on the weekend of Friday 23<sup>rd</sup> to Sunday 25<sup>th</sup> May. The county was alive with activity as many events took place across Leitrim to celebrate the culture, community and craic. Event organisers have been contacted by the CE with thanks for all their efforts and there is currently a survey available for them to complete online to gauge their feedback on the event overall. Final tasks are continuing with regards to closing things off (such as payments to event organisers and the procurement of photo and video content at the events).

### **Leitrim Economic Forum and Global Business Network**

The 1<sup>st</sup> meeting of the Leitrim Economic Forum took place on 13<sup>th</sup> May; two main milestones were defined- 1) the Development of a Skills Strategy for the county and a Leitrim Business Summit event scheduled for 2026. Subgroups of the Economic Forum have also been established to take these priorities forward. Work continued activities arising from the 1<sup>st</sup> meeting of the Leitrim Global Business Network which took place on 7<sup>th</sup> April. A further meeting is scheduled for 9<sup>th</sup> June.

### **DRCD Funded Schemes**

The CLÁR scheme funding scheme closed on 16<sup>th</sup> May and had a very strong interest. The Town and Village scheme remains open until 6<sup>th</sup> June.

### **Leitrim County Council Project Development Grant**

Engaging with successful applicants to progress projects deemed eligible under this Scheme.

### LOCAL ENTERPRISE OFFICE (LEO)

### **Training, Mentoring & Export**

This month we ran an online <u>Canva for Beginners Training</u> course and an in person Start Your Own Business weekend course.

Women from across counties Leitrim, Longford and Westmeath came together on the 29<sup>th</sup> of May in The Landmark Hotel, Carrick on Shannon to attend a Tri County Women in Business event. The aim of strengthening connections and collaboration among women entrepreneurs across the three counties. The event was hosted by Ruth Larkin from Lark Bridal. She was accompanied by three guest business speakers from Leitrim, Longford & Westmeath, all of whom shared their entrepreneurial journeys to date.

### All In a Day's Work Programmes & Associated Financial Supports

The "All in A Day's Work" campaign continues to be rolled out on the areas of Lean, Green and Digital supports. There is significant growth in demand for all three supports, in particular the Energy Efficiency Grant (EEG) and Grow Digital (GD) Voucher. The EEG, with up to 75% of eligible costs up to a maximum grant of €10,000 can be supported following the completion of a Green for Business, Green Start or a SEAI Energy Audit. The GD voucher is a grant covering 50% of eligible costs (minimum grant of €500 up to a maximum grant of €5,000) limited to new software subscriptions for a period of 12 and training and configuration of the software.

### **Atlantic Economic Corridor Update:**

### **Interreg Europe Digital Rural**

Participation in the Interreg Europe Digital Rural Project continues. Leitrim County Council are a partner on the project to examine ways to improve polices for the development of smart towns and villages. The project will run until 2028. On Monday 13<sup>th</sup> October 2025 a national conference will be held in Lough Rynn Castle on the topic of Smart Town and Villages. Delegates from the Digital Rural project will then spend two days in Leitrim attending presentations and site visits for various projects and initiatives.

### **PEACE Plus: Digital Services Funding**

Leitrim County Council are a partner in the recently successful 'DS3 project' under PEACE Plus investment area 2.4 Smart Towns and villages The DS3 Project aims to increase cross border collaboration and co-operation engaging civil and business communities in the adoption of ICT solutions in community service delivery and economic activity, thereby creating more connected and sustainable communities. The project will run from February 2025 to January 2028.

### **Creative Heartlands**

Creative Heartlands is continuing its programme of training, workshops and events for the Design and Film sectors in Leitrim, Sligo and Roscommon. Funding for various programmes has been received from Enterprise Ireland, Skillnet, National Talent Academy and Leader.

### **Mohill RRDF**

A painting scheme is currently being rolled out in Mohill. This is funded under the Rural Regeneration Development Fund.

### Northwest Regional Enterprise Plan Implementation

### **Vision Development/Next REP Development**

The x3 Chief Executives from Leitrim/Sligo/Donegal are collaborating to develop a Northwest Region Vision which will feed into the REP development in 2025. In May, the tender went on e-tenders to get a consultant on board to develop the regional vision.

### West/Northwest Renewable/Wind energy working group

The Northwest Regional Enterprise Plan hosted the DETE Offshore Wind team in Oweninny Wind Farm for a quarterly joint meeting – a forum to ensure all regions are aware/considered in the development of this industry in Ireland.

### **Ministerial visit to Steering Committee**

Minister Alan Dillon TD, Department of Enterprise, attended the Northwest Regional Enterprise Plan Steering committee meeting in May. Regional collaboration, the review of the REPs and rural economic development were key issues discussed.

### **TOURISM**

### **Marketing Campaign**

Filming and audio recordings took place in May for the production of videos for the Sustainable Leitrim Campaign. Footage was captured across the county to showcase its highlights and give visitors a taste of Leitrim's tourism offerings. The campaign, which includes radio, PR, TV, and digital components, will launch in June. As part of the campaign, RTE's, 'The Today Show' visited the county, with presenter James Patrice recording segments from Drumhierny Woodland Hideaway and The Shed Distillery. Interviews were conducted with guests including Seamus O'Rourke, Adventure Gently, Jinny's Bakery, and Ciara Maxwell, who leads the Marketing Subgroup.

### **Visitor Information App**

The visitor app is now in its final phase of testing, with content being added regularly. A separate promotion of the app is also in development, which will include social media campaigns, digital banners, point-of-sale displays, and training for front-of-house staff to raise awareness and encourage downloads.

### **Tourism Ireland Webinar**

The tourism team attended the Tourism Ireland Slow Tourism webinar, gaining valuable insights into marketing strategies for this sector.

### **Tourism Forum**

The second meeting of the Tourism Forum in 2025 took place in Ballinamore and was well attended. The group discussed the priority actions for the year, which will be implemented by the five subgroups.

### **Festival and Event Grants Update**

Claims for St. Patrick's Day events and festival grants are currently being processed. Promotion of festivals and events continues.

### **Tourism Officers Network**

The tourism officer attended the National Tourism Officers Network meeting in Tallaght, Co. Dublin. This valuable network allows officers to share information and experiences.

**The Leitrim Gathering** The tourism team is assisting with the promotion of The Leitrim Gathering through radio, email marketing, and social media.

**Social Media Engagement** Throughout May, all social media platforms—Instagram, Facebook, and Twitter—were actively managed, resulting in increased engagement across all channels.

Acres Lake Facilities Centre Work on the Acres Lake Facilities Centre is progressing.

- N16 Pavement Overlay Scheme (POS) Manorhamilton to Cornacloy Phase 2 This POS commenced in November 2024 and works are now substantially completed. Scheme to be closed out in 2025
- **N4 Pavement Overlay Scheme Carrick on Shannon** Consultants are currently working on the design and tender documents for this Pavement Overlay Scheme. Consultants are also looking at additional drainage work required due to poor condition of storm drainage. Once detailed drainage design is completed, this pavement overlay scheme will be tendered, subject to TII approval.

### **Applications and Assessments**

### **Applications:**

55 new social housing support applications have been accepted to date in 2025. Currently there are 510 approved housing applicants on our waiting list. A further 12 are within the assessment process and 1 applicant have been allocated a property and await appointment.

### New Tenancies To date in 2025:

14 new Local Authority/Approved Housing Body (AHB) tenancies have commenced in 2025.

### **Traveller Accommodation Programme 2025-2029**

The new Traveller Accommodation Programme 2025-2029 which came into effect on 1<sup>st</sup> January 2025 sets out an overall 5-year target for provision of 20 units. At the end of May 2025, the Housing Department have provided **2 no. units** under the Standard Local Authority Housing Scheme.

### **Housing Grants**

2025 Allocation - Housing Adaptation Grants for Older People and Disabled People Scheme

The Department for Housing, Local Government and Heritage have advised that the Exchequer capital allocation to Leitrim County Council for the payment of the Housing Adaptation Grants for Older People and Disabled People scheme for private homes in 2025 is €1,162,948. As claims will be submitted for applications under both the previous schemes and the revised schemes during 2025, the contribution of matched funding from Leitrim County Council will be a minimum of €205,226 (i.e. depending on the number of claims completed and recouped under the pre 1 December scheme and the number submitted under the revised scheme) to be provided from the authority's own resources. The estimated combined capital allocation to Leitrim County Council is €1,368,174 on that basis.

A total of 78 Housing Grant Applications has been received to date in 2025. 21 grants have been approved, totalling €117,312.50 in grant funding. 56 applications are under assessment and 1 valid applications are on hand awaiting assessment.

### **Social Housing Rent Review**

The Rent Review is currently being progressed with tenant information being updated in our housing database.

### **Social Housing Delivery**

The Housing Capital Team continue to progress the delivery of the annual targets under 'Housing for All'. Progress at 31<sup>st</sup> May 2025 on the social housing (new housing construction dwellings pipelined for delivery) is as follows:

 Work is ongoing on the demolition and re-construction of the recently purchased vacant and semi derelict neighbouring 2-bedroom properties on Sean MacDiarmada Street, Manorhamilton into four one-bedroom social housing units under the Buy & Renew Scheme.

In addition, works progressed on a number of other 'pipeline delivery projects' to provide additional new social housing supply in 2025 and 2026.

### **Capital Assistance Scheme**

Expressions of Interest (EOI) are now being sought from landowners that may have a suitable site available for the proposed development. Completed Expressions of Interest forms will be accepted until 28<sup>th</sup> May 2025.

### **Private Rented Inspection Programme 2025**

The Housing Department has an annual target to inspect accommodation in the private rented sector. In 2025, a total of 326 properties will be inspected and several properties may also have to be re-inspected to monitor compliance with the standards where any issues were identified in the initial inspection. (\*The indicative target for the number of inspections in 2025 is 326 and this may be subject to change at a later date).


### **Energy Efficiency**

The Energy Efficiency Retrofit Scheme is ongoing with the focus on targeting the houses with the lowest BER rating. In 2025, the Department has set a target of 16 units and progress is on track for delivery by Q4, 2025.

### **Forward Planning**

### Carrick-on-Shannon Joint Local Area Plan

The Carrick-on-Shannon Joint Local Area Plan (JLAP) was formally made by Leitrim and Roscommon County Councils on 7<sup>th</sup> April 2025 at their respective Carrick-on-Shannon and Boyle Municipal District meetings. The JLAP has taken effect from 19<sup>th</sup> May 2025.

### County Development Plan 2023-2029

Work is nearing completion on the preparation of the Chief Executive's report on progress in realising each of the objectives contained in the County Development Plan. It is expected that this will be submitted to the Elected Members with the July Council meeting agenda.

### Residential Zoned Land Tax

Annual Draft RZLT maps were published on the 31st of January. Landowners had until April 1st 2025 to make submissions with regard to the inclusion of lands as being within scope of the provisions of RZLT or seeking to have such lands dezoned. A total of 7 no. submissions have been received which the Planning Department will consider in the coming weeks. These submissions have been acknowledged.

### Heritage

- Three Heritage Events took place as part of The Leitrim Gathering. These were The Big Dig; The
  O'Rourke's of Leitrim Mobile Museum; and Glenview Folk Museum open Day.
- A number of Heritage Week 2025 events are being organised for August.
- A new Creative Ireland funded project is being developed which will focus on engaging people with traditional knitting practices from Leitrim.
- Consultants have been appointed for The O'Rourke's of Leitrim Short Film series.
- Consultants have been appointed for The O'Rourke's of Leitrim Interactive Mapping project.
- The Leitrim Heritage Plan 2026 2030 Pre-Draft Public Consultation took place with 68 no. responses received from the public.
